## Intentional Community Consortium (ICC) Hosted a Press Conference on Parliament Hill

**March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024 -** OTTAWA, ON - The Intentional Community Consortium, in collaboration with Reena, Community Living Toronto, OASIS, and Provincial Network on Developmental Services, announced its 'Day on the Hill' with an MP Reception on Tuesday, March 19<sup>th</sup>, and a press conference held on Parliament Hill on Wednesday, March 20th, 2024, at 10:00 a.m. ET.

The Hon. Ya'ara Saks, MP for York Centre and Minister of Mental Health and Addictions, Associate Minister of Health, joined the MP Reception on Tuesday to deliver closing remarks. Minister Saks' presence underscores the government's commitment to addressing the challenges faced by individuals with developmental disabilities, particularly in accessing supportive housing.

Consortium leaders addressed the importance of the National Housing Strategy and reiterated the significance of plans to increase deeply affordable and supportive housing for those with Developmental Disabilities across Canada.

The press conference commenced with remarks from supported individuals and agency CEO's and were followed by a media questions and answer session.

The National Housing Strategy presents an opportunity to make a significant difference in the lives of people with developmental disabilities. By increasing deeply affordable housing, the ICC seeks to provide solutions leading to better opportunities for this marginalized population.
